

### **Academic Misconduct (AM) Penalty System**

The Academic Misconduct Penalty System has been created and developed based on the <u>AMBer Plagiarism Reference Tariff</u> and <u>Benchmark Plagiarism Tariff</u>. The purpose is to create a consistent and equitable application of penalties for <u>proven</u> cases of academic misconduct in accordance with the <u>RVC Student Academic Misconduct Procedures</u>.

The AM Penalty System should be used by staff alongside the AM Procedures to help aid the decision-making process. The appointed staff should give additional judgment around mitigating and aggravating factors which cannot be reasonably accounted for in the AM Penalty System.

# Assign points based on the following criteria

## HISTORY

1st Time	100 points
2nd Time	150 points
3rd/+ Time	200 points

#### AMOUNT / FXTENT

Below 5% AND less than two sentences	80 points
As above but with <b>critical aspects*</b> plagiarised	105 points
Between 5% and 20% <b>OR</b> more than two sentences but not more than two paragraphs	105 points
As above but with <b>critical aspects</b> * plagiarised	130 points
Between 20% and 50% <b>OR</b> more than two paragraphs but not more than five paragraphs	130 points
As above but with <b>critical aspects</b> * plagiarised	160 points
Above 50% <b>OR</b> more than five paragraphs	160 points
Submission purchased from essay mill or ghostwriting service †	225 points

<sup>\*</sup> Critical aspects are key ideas central to the assignment

# LEVEL / STAGE

Level 1/1st Year of study	70 points
Level 2/UG (year 2 onwards)	115 points
Level 3/PG Taught	140 points

# VALUE OF ASSIGNMENT

Standard weighting (below 30 credits)	30 points
Large project (30 credits and above)	60 points

# PENALTIES (Intent to deceive)

Evidence of a deliberate attempt to disguise plagiarism by changing words, sentences, or references to avoid detection

Where intent to deceive is determined, the minimum penalty will be a mark of 0 (Zero).

# PENALTIES (Formative Work)

280 - 379	Informal warning
380+	A formal warning, with a record made contributing to the student's previous history

# Award penalties based on the points

# PENALTIES (Summative Work)

In all cases a formal warning is given, and a record made contributing to the student's previous history

Level	Points	Plagiarism available penalties (select one)
Level 0 All	N/A	<ul> <li>For all cases where it has been decided plagiarism has taken place, a formal warning is given.</li> <li>A record of the justified misconduct will be held on the Student Resolution and Compliance records for 6 years after the last action is taken.</li> </ul>
In addition, the decision maker may apply one of the following penalties as appropriate.		
Level 1	280 -329	<ul> <li>Formal warning</li> <li>Marks awarded without taking into account the plagiarised sections.</li> </ul>
Level 2	330 - 479	<ul> <li>Marks awarded without taking into account the plagiarised sections.</li> <li>Assignment awarded 0% marks – student enters the Consequences of Failure section under the Assessment and Award Regulations</li> </ul>

Level 3 480 -	<ul> <li>Assignment awarded 0% marks – student enters the Consequences of Failure section under the Assessment and Award Regulations</li> <li>Referral to an Academic Misconduct Panel</li> </ul>
Level 4 525	<ul> <li>Module awarded no mark – consequences of failure are initiated.</li> <li>Suspension from the programme of study and requirement to retake, resit and resubmit an assessment or module in whole or part.</li> <li>Withdraw the student with credits retained or removed.</li> <li>Revoke an award from within 6 months of graduation.</li> </ul>
